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#### 1. Qualitative Information on Financial Results

#### (1) Explanation of Results of Operations

During the six months ended September 30, 2014 (from April 1, 2014 to September 30, 2014), the world economy showed some positive signs, such as continued recovery trend in the U.S. and an upturn in the employment and earning environment as well as improved corporate appetite for capital investment despite a sense of uncertainty due to geopolitical risk in Europe. Moreover, in Asia, while slowdown trend of economic growth persisted mainly in China and India, the economy in Japan sustained a mild recovery trend, thanks to yen depreciation and rising stock prices resulting from the effect of Abenomics.

In order to adapt to a drastically changing business environment, the group has set out to reform our corporate structure with GlobalOne, which would unify our group and unleash newfound collaborative power. Specific measures and quantitative targets have been set out in the three-year medium-term business plan, and the group has been implementing them since the previous fiscal year. With the three major themes of 1) creating opportunities for new growth in creative fields, 2) strengthening the global brand, and 3) management that is responsive to diversification, the group will further press ahead with GlobalOne as we seek to build a strong business foundation for new growth.

With regard to our sales structure, we reorganized them into the three global blocks constituting "Europe, the Middle East and Africa," "Asia and the Pacific," and "North America and Central and South America" and worked on reinforcing the management structure within each region. Our sales subsidiaries will identify local needs precisely to deliver the optimum solutions for their regions by leveraging the experience and know-how they have built up to date and working in partnership with sales agencies in their regions to promote sales and marketing activities.

Moreover, in terms of our production structure, we are steadily expanding the scale of production at our Thai plant, our overseas production site that commenced full-scale operations in October 2012, introducing the same "Digital Yatai" (digitally-controlled cell production system) used in production in Japan to ensure high quality while responding to growth in demand.

Under these conditions, regarding sales by product for the six months ended September 30, 2014, sales for printers exceeded the same period in the previous fiscal year as sales of the new VS-i series for the sign market and LEF series of compact flatbed UV printers, launched in the previous term performed favorably. Sales of 3D products also increased from the same period of the previous fiscal year as DWX series of dental milling machines, and other products showed a growth.

As for sales by region, sales in Japan were higher than the same period of the previous fiscal year, thanks to significant sales growth in dental milling machines. Sales in North America and Europe were also higher than the same period of the previous fiscal year due to the depreciation of the yen in addition to robust sales of VS-i and LEF series as well as dental milling machines. In Asia, sales were robust mainly for printers which meet local needs, and sales were higher than the same period of the previous fiscal year.

As a result of the above, sales for the six months ended September 30, 2014 were up 16.1% over the same period of the previous term to 22,934 million yen. As for expenses, despite an increase in selling, general and administrative expenses, the cost to sales ratio improved mainly due to the effect of purchasing cost reductions at overseas subsidiaries accompanying the depreciation of the yen. Consequently, operating income climbed 50.4% compared with the same period of the previous term to 3,803 million yen, and ordinary income rose 38.8% compared with the same period of the previous term to 3,592 million yen. However, due to the recording of impairment loss on goodwill of 213 million yen at a consolidated subsidiary in Denmark, net quarterly income increased 31.8% compared with the same period of the previous term to 2,169 million yen.

The exchange rates of major currencies during the second quarter (average rate during the period from January 2014 to June 2014 because the fiscal year of the Company's foreign consolidated subsidiaries is from January to December) were 102.47 yen to the US dollar (95.59 yen for the same period of the previous term) and 140.44 yen to the euro (125.53 yen for the same period of the previous term).

#### (2) Explanation of Financial Position

Total assets as of the end of the second quarter decreased by 1,240 million yen compared with end-of-term consolidated totals last year to a total of 37,684 million yen (96.8% of year-end consolidated totals last term). As for current assets, cash and deposits decreased by 1,455 million yen, and notes and accounts receivable – trade decreased by 339 million yen. Meanwhile, raw materials and supplies increased by 333 million yen, and other current assets increased by 249 million yen. With regard to non-current assets, goodwill decreased by 427 million yen due to an impairment loss.

Liabilities as of the end of the second quarter increased by 8,786 million yen to a total of 17,035 million yen (206.5% of year-end consolidated totals last term). Notes and accounts payable – trade increased by 1,301 million yen, and short-term loans payable increased by 8,046 million yen mainly as funds for acquiring treasury stock through a public tender offer. Meanwhile, other current liabilities decreased by 651 million yen.

Net assets as of the end of the second quarter decreased by 10,027 million yen to a total of 20,649 million yen (67.3% of year-end consolidated totals last term). Despite an increase due mainly to the business performance for the six months ended September 30, 2014, retained earnings decreased by 9,139 million yen due to the acquisition of treasury stock and retirement of treasury stock, and treasury stock increased by 467 million yen. At the same time, the foreign currency translation adjustment decreased by 416 million yen owing mainly to a slight appreciation of the yen in the exchange rate compared with the end of the previous fiscal year.

#### (3) Explanation of Future Forecast Information such as Consolidated Performance Forecast

No revisions have been made to the consolidated financial results forecasts for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2015, which were announced on May 14, 2014.

#### 2. Matters Concerning Summary Information (Notes)

Changes in Accounting Policies changes in accounting estimates and corrections of errors

(Changes in Accounting Policies)

Effective from the beginning of the first quarter of the current fiscal year, the Company has adopted the provisions stated in the main clause of Paragraph 35 of the "Accounting Standard for Retirement Benefits" (Accounting Standards Board of Japan (ASBJ) Statement No. 26, May 17, 2012; hereinafter the "Accounting Standard") and Paragraph 67 the "Guidance on Accounting Standard for Retirement Benefits" (ASBJ Guidance No. 25, May 17, 2012; hereinafter the "Guidance"). Accordingly, the calculation methods for retirement benefit obligations and service cost has been reviewed, and as a result, the calculation method for attributing expected retirement benefit obligations to periods was changed from the straight-line method to the benefit formula method. In addition, the method for determining the discount rate has been changed from the method based on the number of years similar to the average remaining period of employees to the single weighted-average discount rate that reflects the amounts within the expected payment period of retirement benefits and each amount for such expected payment period.

This change in accounting policy has no impact on the quarterly consolidated financial statements.

At the meeting of the Board of Directors held on May 14, 2014, the Company resolved to conduct a public tender offer for treasury stock, and acquired 3,560,000 shares of treasury stock in an amount of 11,420,480 thousand yen as of July 3, 2014. Moreover, at the meeting of the Board of Directors held on August 19, 2014, the Company resolved to retire the treasury stock. As a result of the retirement of 3,414,489 shares as of September 10, 2014, treasury stock and retained earnings decreased by 10,952,955 thousand yen, respectively.

#### (Significant Subsequent Events)

(Disposal of Treasury Stock through Third-party Allotment)

At the meeting of the Board of Directors held on November 6, 2014, the Company resolved to dispose treasury stock through third-party allotment.

#### 1. Purpose and reason

As of May 14, 2014, the Company resolved to introduce the "Director Stock Benefit Trust," which is a share-based compensation plan linked to performance for certain directors of the Company, for the purpose of enhancing their sense of contribution to medium- and long-term improvement of business performance and increased corporate value, and at the 33rd Ordinary Shareholders Meeting held on June 18, 2014, the plan was resolved as directors' compensations. In addition, as of May 14, 2014, the Company resolved to introduce the "J-ESOP Trust," which is a share-based compensation plan linked to performance for the Company's employees with a certain level of qualification, as a new welfare program.

The disposal of treasury stock will be conducted through third-party allotment to Resona Bank, Limited (Trust Account), a trustee of the Director Stock Benefit Trust and J-ESOP Trust, (trustee under trust agreement with Resona Bank, Limited: Japan Trustee Services Bank, Ltd. (Trust Account)).
